

# EMERGENT LITERACY (ENGLISH)



"Imagination Hour: Where Stories Shape Young Minds"

Storytelling is one of the most engaging ways to nurture children's personality and enhance their creative abilities. It helps them develop good values while also expanding their vocabulary.

- Narrate simple, age-appropriate stories and ask your child questions to recall characters and events.
- Encourage your child to imagine a new ending or describe what might happen next.
- Introduce a few new words while reading the story, explain their meanings and later encourage your child to use these words in their own sentences.
  - Motivate your child to use English in everyday conversations to help build their confidence and improve fluency in expressing themselves.

"Tiny Faces, Big Emotions:
A Journey Into Feelings"



Emotions play a big role in children's growth, and when they learn to understand and express how they feel, they become more confident, kind, and better at communicating with others. Play the suggested fun games to support this important development in a joyful and engaging way!



#### Mirror Game

Take turns making emotional faces in a mirror (sad, happy, surprised) and let your child guess or copy them to learn emotions through expressions.

### Feelings Freeze Dance

Play music and let the child dance around. When the music stops, call out an emotion (e.g., "excited," "joyful," "shy") and the child has to freeze in a pose that shows that feeling.



# 'My Mood Plate'

On a plate let me draw a face, And show my mood in a happy place! Excited, surprised, or full of cheer, Let the feelings shine right here!

#### You Will Need:

- Any sturdy base (a piece of cardboard/a small wooden plaque/a foam board/ thick cardstock)
- Paper plate (any size and shape)
- Fevicol
- Water colours, crayons
- Decoration material of your choice like buttons, yarns etc

### Steps To Follow:

- Steps 1: Paste the paper plate on a sturdy base and encourage your child to colour it with water colour.
- Step 2: Help your child choose an emotion and bring it to life on the plate; using crayons, buttons to form expressive eyes, eyebrows, and a matching mouth.
- Decorate the face with any other craft material like yarn for hair or stickers using different techniques of printing.

## ABC Magic Moments



Building Foundational Literacy is key to child's early learning journey! Help your child recapitulate the letters done (i/I, l/L and t/T) in class by practicing their recognition, sounds, and formation in fun ways. Some suggested activities are:

- <u>Alphabet Treasure Hunt</u>: Hide letter cards around the house and ask your child to find and name them aloud along with their phonic sounds.
- <u>Tracing Fun</u>: Fill a tray with salt or flour and let your child trace letters with his/her finger. Then move to dotted lines and gradually practice writing letters on single dots, just like in class.





Foundational numeracy goes beyond counting—it's about exploring numbers, patterns, and early math through joyful, hands-on experiences. Help your child recapitulate the numbers done (1, 4, 7) in class by engaging in fun activities that build number recognition, quantification and correct number formation.

Some suggested activities are:

- <u>Guess the claps</u>: Blindfold your child, clap a few times, and let him/her guess the number thereby boosting listening skills and number recognition.
- Number Hunt: Hide number cards around the house for your child to find and say aloud. Then, let him/her collect the same number of objects thereby developing number recognition and counting skills.
- <u>Tracing Fun</u>: Fill a tray with salt or flour and let your child trace numbers with his/her finger. Then move to dotted lines and gradually practice writing letters on single dots, just like in class.
- <u>Create Your Own Flash Card</u>: Take half of an A4 pastel sheet. On one side help your child write the number with correct formation and on the other side encourage them to draw or paste that many objects to match the number.
